2.3.1 Promotion of Research	 Research Committee not constituted. Faculty are provided leave to pursue Ph.D. work. One Major and five Minor Research Projects pursued.
2.3.2 Resources Mobilization for Research	 College has no budgetary provision for research. Faculty have mobilized Rs.4,52,147 in the form of Projects from the UGC. Interdisciplinary research not yet initiated.
2.3.3 Research Facilities	 Research facilities are inadequate. Internet facility available to teachers. Seed money is not provided to the faculty to initiate research.
2.3.4: Research Publications and Awards	 Faculty members have published a few books and research articles. No professional academic awards received by the faculty yet. One of the Faculty members is on the Editorial board of an International Journal.

OPAC system is not introduced so far. No amenities are available for physically challenged students in the library.
