


Students of different semesters and courses responded to the feedback collection process during the academic session 2022- 2023.




4. More than 77% students are of opinion that the project work / field work / internship / tutorial as prescribed in curriculum are helpful to understand the subject in a better way.


- 1. Internet connection has been upgraded.


4. The teachers are divided over the issue of availability of sufficient reference materials and books for the topics mentioned in the curriculum.


1. More than 87 % alumni feel that the curriculum taught in the college was very helpful to acquire the prerequisite and basic knowledge required for the career development.






2. More than 90% are satisfied with the quality of education which is an essential key to reallearning and human development.






Students' Satisfaction Survey 2022-23









More than 85% students opine that teachers inform them their competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes in details. This help them understand the course in a more effective way.



More than 85% students are happy with the way mentors do regular follow-up of their academic, mental and social growth. Remaining 15% students feel differently. So improvement can be made in this direction.



More than 92% students are satisfied with the fruitful way the teachers help them understand the different concepts of the course by the help of examples and applications.






